The BVN Recycled Film Festival invites students to “recycle” a public-domain film by tearing it apart and constructing a completely new film in one of five different genres.

What's a public-domain film? That means that the film isn't protected by copyright, and that you can use it for free.

And you don't need any specialized equipment to participate in this contest—just a computer and one of the many consumer video editing programs available. The contest is open to everyone at BVN.

The rules in brief:

1. Make a three-minute video.
2. Use only the video we provide.
 - you may add effects.
 - you may add titles.
 - you may add layers.
 - you may add music.
 - you may add voice-over.
 - you may edit as you like.
3. School-appropriate, please.
4. Submit your video by 8/18/10.
